Changes for Daniels and Cole

- 1. Extended "Great Room" by 4 feet.
- 2. Added 7 ft wide porch similar to that in the Bluffton.
- 3. The redesigned Utility, Walk-in Closet, and Primary Bath are all 8'wide. That straight interior partition is more efficient to build.
- 4. Moved Water Heater to Utility Room which is where a WH is traditionally located. Eliminated separate closet for WH.
- 5. Primary Bath double sinks have been substituted with same type of single unit as used in the other bath.
- 6. Kitchen has been redesigned because the original kitchen design would now block the door to the primary bedroom. The kitchen redesign includes:
- 7. Refrigerator moved to opposite side of kitchen.
- Cabinet beside the stove replaced by a larger cabinet. This cabinet is the same model as the one beside the sink. Note: this larger cabinet helps offset the space lost by eliminating the Pantry.
- 9. **Furnace** located near smaller bath has been eliminated because it is not needed in our North Carolina climate. This allows Bedroom #2 and 3 to redesigned to provide more interior space.
 - VERIFY the heat pump meets NC specs when there is no furnace. If not a Gas Fire place, Wood Stove, or electric heaters added instead of having a furnace.
- 10. The double window in Bedroom #2 has been changed to 2 singles, with one on each exterior wall for cross ventilation. Note: all other Windows have been moved somewhat, but

Features Of The New Design

- The changes listed above have resulted in a more efficient design from a construction standpoint. Specifically
 - straight line walls see #3.
 - deleted WH closet see #4,
 - deleted Furnace and its closet see #9.
- b. Also illustrating the efficiency of the design is the fact that there are NO corridors/halls.
- c. The changes listed above have also produced a better design from a customer viewpoint. In particular:

Much bigger porch

Larger bedrooms

Much larger Walk-In Closet
